Hon'ble Agriculture and Farmers Welfare Minister of Government of India, Shri Radha Mohan Singh laid foundation stone of College of Horticulture and Forestry at Piprakothi Motihari on 26th May 2018. This will be seventh college under university. He showed keen interest in technologies developed by University, especially Mushroom products like 'Biscuits', 'Mini Samosa', 'Namkin', 'Matsya Bandhu, a solar powered mobile fridge for fish vendors', 'Solar powered pumping systems', 'Boer crossed goats', Cauliflower transport system', 'Maize Sheller', and 'Hole maker for mulched cultivation'. He appreciated the efforts of Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor, Dr R. C. Srivastava and emphasised that since past two years University is growing rapidly.

He also chaired a technical session on 'Gender Equality and Empowerment of Women'.





Hon'ble Vice-Chancellor, Dr Ramesh Chandra Srivastava inaugurated "Roving Conference" of Maize farmers at Tirhut College of Agriculture, Dholi. During the Conference he interacted with farmers and seed company representatives. He reiterated that Maize productivity can be increased to a higher level. For this, focus is required on soil health management. He also explained about variety development for specific purpose poultry and animal feed, starch production for human consumption and irrigation management for better return from inter cropping.
